The lecture will explore the implications of the employment and unemployment realities for the future of Nambia's urban areas. It will also discuss the significance of the current narratives on industrialisation and 'job creation' in light of the existing urban livelihoods and labour prospects.

James Ferguson is the Susan S. and William H. Hindle Professor in the School of Humanities and Sciences, as well as in the Department of Anthropology, Stanford University. His major publications include: The Anti-politics Machine: "Development", Depoliticization, and Bureaucratic Power in Lesotho (Cambridge UP, 1990); Expectations of Modernity: Myths and Meanings of Urban Life on the Zambian Copperbelt (U.
